New 20 MPH Speed Limit in Lakewood Aims to Improve Safety | WELCA Encourages Drivers to Follow Suit

The City of Lakewood has officially reduced the speed limit in residential areas to 20 miles per hour, part of a broader effort to create calmer, safer streets for families, children, cyclists, and pedestrians alike. This move follows a growing national trend of cities and towns lowering residential speed limits to cut

down on accidents and create more livable, walkable neighborhoods. Although WELCA is technically outside of Lakewood's jurisdiction, we wholeheartedly support the spirit of this change. Our community is just as walkable, just as filled with children playing, neighbors walking dogs, families biking together, and residents

enjoying the outdoors. Slowing down—literally—helps protect what makes our neighborhood so special. We encourage everyone driving through WELCA to treat our streets with the same care and caution as those in Lakewood. Adopting the 20 MPH limit here, unofficially, will go a long way in keeping our neighbors safe.
